- 1 member active in a Carpinteria business organization
- 1 member active in a senior citizens' organization
- 1 member active in a taxpayers' association
- 3 members of the community at large

The committee currently has five community member positions open as listed:

- **1 member active in a taxpayers' association**
- **1 member active in a senior citizens' organization**
- **1 member of the community at large**

The Governing Board will review applications and appoint members to the committee at its February 23, 2021 Regular Board Meeting. Terms will be effective 3/10/21 – 3/10/23.

The Board of Education of the Carpinteria Unified School District is seeking qualified, interested individuals to serve on a committee of community leaders which will serve as the Independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee ("CBOC") for the implementation of the District's Measure U school facilities bond program.

Proposition 39 Bond Election

On November 4, 2014, voters residing within the Carpinteria Unified School District passed Measure U. Measure U is a \$90,000,000 bond measure that authorizes funding for needed repairs, upgrades, and new construction projects to the District's schools. Proposition 39 required a 55% supermajority for approval; Measure U was passed by 65.41%.

Establishment of a Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee

After a bond authorized under Proposition 39 is passed, state law requires that the Carpinteria Unified School District Board appoint an Independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee to work with the District.

Committee Responsibilities

In accordance with Education Code Section 15278(b), the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee shall:

- Inform the public concerning the District's expenditure of Measure U bond proceeds;
- Review expenditure reports produced by the District to ensure that Measure U bond proceeds were expended only for the purposes set forth in Measure U; and
- Present to the Board in public session, an annual written report outlining their activities and conclusions regarding the expenditure of Measure U bond proceeds.

The Bylaws which govern the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee are attached to this Application.

Appointment of Committee Members

All appointments will be made by the Board from applications submitted to the District.

Time Commitment and Term

The committee generally meets on a quarterly basis on dates established in advanced. Appointments are for a two (2) year term. Members may serve no more than three (3) consecutive terms.
